

determine the position on the United States representative special election ballot that his party and its candidates shall occupy, with number one being the first position on the ballot, number two being the second, number three being the third, and so on down the ballot until all major parties are placed on the ballot. The same procedure shall be followed in a separate drawing for minor parties' ballot positions. In the event a state party chairman or his designated representative fails to appear as notified for such drawing, the secretary of state shall draw for that political party.

E. The names of all independent candidates shall be printed on the United States representative special election ballot in a position under the heading "Independent" which position shall be located below or after the political party positions. In the event two or more independent candidates run for the same office, their names shall be located on the ballot in alphabetical order.

F. The sample ballot posted in each polling place and all sample ballots distributed to each polling place shall reflect the actual positioning of parties on the voting machine in that precinct.
